## DIRECTIONS

I) Students will flip a picture card on the mat.

## QUICK DIFFERENTIATION


#### KIDS THAT NEED A CHALLENGE:

- 2) Students can sort the words depending on how many syllables are in each word.


### KIDS THAT NEED A REVIEW:
