DIRECTIONS

- 1) Students will use a pocket chart.
- 2) Students will count the words in the sentence on the card.
- 3) Students will then sort the card according to how many words they count in the sentence.

QUICK DIFFERENTIATION

KIDS THAT NEED A CHALLENGE:

- I) Have students generate a sentence on their own with the same amount of words and then write it paying attention to the spaces between the words.
- 2) Have them add their sentence to the sort.

KIDS THAT NEED A REVIEW:

- Pull students into a small group and model how to say the sentence slowly to segment the words they hear using counters.
- 2) Show the students the spaces between the words to help identify the individual words.
- 3) Remind students they don't need to read the words yet to count the words in a sentence.
